



BANNED BOOK WEEK—OCTOBER 1-7

Banned book week, October 1-7, celebrates the freedom to read and spotlights current and historical attempts to censor books in libraries and schools.

In 2022 the American Library Association documented over 1,200 demands to censor library books and resources. According to their director of the Office for Intellectual Freedom, "This is a dangerous time for readers and the public servants who provide access to reading materials. Readers, particularly students, are losing access to critical information, and librarians and teachers are under attack for doing their jobs."



SUPPORT THE LIBRARY
